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Returning Merchandise for Service

Chapter 1

Safety Guidelines

To avoid personal injury and property damage, carefully follow all the safety steps listed below when accessing your system or handling the components.

1-1 ESD Safety Guidelines

Electrostatic Discharge (ESD) can damage electronic components. To prevent damage to your system, it is important to handle it very carefully. The following measures are generally sufficient to protect your equipment from ESD.

- Use a grounded wrist strap designed to prevent static discharge.
- Touch a grounded metal object before removing a component from the antistatic bag.
- Handle the backplane by its edges only; do not touch its components, peripheral chips, memory modules, or gold contacts.
- When handling chips or modules, avoid touching their pins.
- Put the card and peripherals back into their antistatic bags when not in use.

1-2 General Safety Guidelines

- Always disconnect power cables before installing or removing any components from the computer, including the backplane.
- Disconnect the power cable before installing or removing any cables from the backplane.
- Make sure that the backplane is securely and properly installed on the motherboard to prevent damage to the system due to power shortage.

2-1 Front Connectors




Figure 2-1. Front Connectors

2-2 Front Connector Pin Definitions

#1. CPLD Upgrade Port

The JTAG connector, designated J16, is used only by the manufacturer to upgrade the CPLD.

#2. Sideband Headers

The sideband headers are designated J28, for SAS #0-#3, and J29, for SAS #4-#7. For SAS or SATA to work properly, you must connect an 8-pin sideband cable. See the table to the right for pin definitions.

NOTE: SGPIO is the default setting for this backplane.

#3. - 6. NVMe Connectors

The NVMe ports are used to connect the NVMe drive cables. OCuLink cables CBL-SAST-0819 should be used to connect these ports to a quad port NVMe add-on card in PCle slot 9 of motherboard X11DPG-QT.

#7. - 14. SAS Connectors

The SAS ports are used to connect the SAS or SATA drive cables. The 8 ports are designated #0 - #7. Each port is also compatible with SATA drives. However, mixing SAS and SATA drives in the same enclosure is not recommended. Cables CBL-0188L-02 can be used to connect SATA drives #0-#3 to port I-SATA0-3 and SATA drives #4-#7 to port I-SATA4-7 on motherboard X11DPG-QT. Cables CBL-SAST-0699 can be used to connect SAS drives #0-#3 and #4-#7 to a dual port HBA or RAID controller plugged into any PCIe slot on motherboard X11DPG-QT.

#15. Backplane Main Power Connectors

The 4-pin connectors, designated JPW1, JPW2, and JPW3, provide power to the backplane. See the tables on the right for pin definitions.

2-3 Front Jumper Locations and Pin Definitions





Figure 2-2. Front Jumpers

Explanation of Jumpers

To modify the operation of the backplane, jumpers can be used to choose between optional settings. Jumpers create shorts between two pins to change the function of the connector. Pin 1 is identified with a square solder pad on the printed circuit board.

Note: On two pin jumpers, "Closed" means the jumper is on and "Open" means the jumper is off the pins.
